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#### 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 In November 2014 Economy & Environment (E & E) Committee approved a set of key E & E performance indicators for 2015/16, covering indicators in the Council's Business Plan and other indicators in the Economy, Transport and Environment (ETE) Finance and Performance report.
- 1.2 In February 2015 E & E Committee approved targets for those key indicators, but requested that additional measures be developed covering three specific areas. The additional measures were approved in March 2015.

#### 2. PROPOSED CHANGES

2.1 Following suggestions by Heads of Service, amendments are proposed to the definitions and targets for two of the previously agreed indicators.

## **County Matter Planning Applications**

- 2.2 The current indicator is the percentage of applications determined within 13 weeks, with an agreed target of 50% for 2015/16.
- 2.3 In order to align with statutory requirements, it is proposed that this is changed to the following: "The percentage of applications determined within 13 weeks or within a longer time period if agreed with the applicant". The proposed target is 100%.
- 2.4 Examples of where a longer time period may need to be agreed with the applicant include:
  - If further information is required from the applicant following consultation and further consultation is required;
  - If the applicant proposes changes to a scheme triggering a further consultation:
  - If the applicant requires further time for negotiating Section 106 agreements.

# Number of adult learners completing courses to improve their chances of employment or progression in work

- 2.5 The agreed target for 2015/16 is 20,000.
- 2.6 In order for the indicator to align with the targeting of harder to reach groups, it is proposed that the definition is changed to the following: "The number of people in the most deprived wards completing courses to improve their chances of employment of progression in work." The most deprived wards being defined as the 10% of wards with the highest index of multiple deprivation as listed in Appendix A
- 2.7 This links to the Council's commitment to tackling deprivation and narrowing the deprivation gap by adopting a more focused and targeted approach to improving performance and outcomes, which was outlined in the motion to Council approved in July last year.

2.8 In the 2013/14 academic year (the latest available figure), the number of learners in this category completing courses was 1,763. A target of 2,000 is proposed for the 2015/16 academic year.
