An email was sent to the Committee from Democratic Services on 26 th February providing the following update: In relation to the 2013-2014 Self-assessment report the following information is specifically about Fenland: In Community Learning there were 462 enrolments in 2013/14 a very slight decrease from 2012/13, 39% of enrolments were male, which is different to the service overall. Provision was originally delivered by the College of West Anglia and in 2013-14 it was delivered by the Adult Learning and Skills Service, with projects for specific groups of learners being delivered by voluntary sector partners. In Family Learning 95 learners took literacy and numeracy courses in 2013-14 which is a high proportion of the overall Family Learning provision in the area. The majority of Fenland learners came to the service with qualifications below level 2 (GCSE	Completed

				level). 15 new learners a week accessed the employability courses in Learning Centres. Information for 2014-2015 so far indicates some increases in engagement with new learners.
