- Increasing concern about scams targeted at vulnerable people and staff working remotely campaigns developed or supported in both of these areas
- Increasing issues around mental health for residents and staff due to prolonged lockdown Now We're Talking campaign due to launch from next week, partnered by BBC TV and Radio.

WORKFORCE UPDATE

- All staff working well remotely. Daily co-ordination of work and welfare checks.
- Reduction in support from Connecting Cambridgeshire comms staff as work for this project is now increasingly needed in the recovery sphere
