Purpose:	To inform the Committee of the activities undertaken by the working group examining the proposals for the provision of the Community Personality Disorder Service,

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1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Committee considered a report from Cambridgeshire and Peterborough NHS Foundation Trust (CPFT) on its proposals for Lifeworks and the Community Personality Disorder Service at its meeting on 29th May 2014. It resolved to set up a working group, consisting of Councillors Anna Bailey, Kilian Bourke, Peter Brown, Tony Orgee and Mandy Smith, to ensure a fair consultation process and co-ordinate a response.
- 1.2 This report summarises the actions undertaken by the working group, and the outcomes so far.

2. MAIN ISSUES

- 2.1 At the request of the Chairman, Emma De Zoete, Consultant in Public Health, provided the working group with adetailed evaluation of the proposals in relation to National Institute for Clinical Excellence (NICE) and other clinical guidelines on the provision of services for people with personality disorder, and attended the working group meetings.
- 2.2 The working group had its first meeting on 25th June, when it identified issues and questions arising from the proposals, particularly the extent to which they were consistent with the clinical guidelines. It had a further meeting on 1st July at which members put its questions to representatives of CPFT. A representative of Healthwatch Cambridgeshire also attended. Working group members have also met with representatives of Lifeworks service users.
- 2.3 The working group will submit a response to the consultation by the 14th July deadline. Its response will include recommendations to the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group, who commission the service. This will be circulated to members and published with the Committee papers for September 2014.

3. SIGNIFICANT IMPLICATIONS

3.1 **Resource Implications**

Depending on the outcome of the consultation some additional NHS resources will be needed to fund the proposed transitional arrangement for the Lifeworks service users in Cambridge and CPFT is working with the CCG to secure these.

3.2 Statutory, Risk and Legal Implications

3.3 Equality and Diversity Implications

CPFT's Equality Impact analysis has identified that overall there is an

improvement in access geographically and in terms of consistency in the type of evidence- based interventions to be provided. CPFT did not identify any adverse impact on any protected group.

The working group's remit includes ensuring a fair consultation process. The working group is liaising with Healthwatch, and the Chairman is liaising with representatives of Lifeworks service users.
