1. Minute 578 - Northstowe Trust Update

To delegate to the Cabinet Member for Communities (would now be the Cabinet Member for Community Engagement) in consultation with the then Deputy Chief Executive: ECS, after consultation with local members, the authority to explore and implement the best possible mechanism to ensure community involvement in the establishment of the new settlement called Northstowe, including the creation of a community trust if appropriate.

Action status: There have been no further developments with regard to the Northstowe Trust given that progress on the development itself stalled and the resolution could therefore not be actioned. However discussions have now recommenced with Gallaghers and the Homes and Communities Agency, as joint promoters for Northstowe with a view to their submitting a revised outline planning application in January 2012.

Future arrangements for library provision will be shaped by the Council's approach to community engagement and community hub development and will require a new Cabinet decision.

2. Minute 159 - Agency Agreement for the Delivery of Highways Related Functions In Cambridge

4. Minute 225 Developer S06 Deferral request - Section 106 Papworth Bypass Contribution.

Following a decision to agree the Section 106 deferral request and to agree that this obligation can be paid in instalments as requested by the developer as follows:

- £270,000 plus indexation payable on 18th March 2011
- £270,000 plus indexation payable on 29th July 2011.

It was also agreed to delegate to the then lead Member for Growth, Infrastructure and Strategic Planning in consultation with the Acting Executive Director for Environment Services and Corporate Director for Finance Property and Performance, the authority to agree any further reasonable changes to the instalment dates.

Lead Member for Growth and Planning Executive Director Environment Services and LGSS Director of Finance A Policy Development Group (PDG) Member Task and Finish Group worked with officers to develop the proposals further. It was originally anticipated that Cabinet would be requested to approve the way ahead and invitation to tender for the Cabinet meeting on 6th September. Officers have however allowed operators more time to come back with ideas, expressions of interest and a report is expected to go forward to the 15th November Cabinet meeting.

6. Minute 348. Building Schools for the Future Fenland Phase 2

Authority was given to the Cabinet Member for Learning and the Executive Director CYPS to continue negotiations to seek an early solution to securing a site for the Fenland Junction Pupil Referral Unit.

A draft agreement is currently being prepared with an expectation that it would be signed by both authorities in the winter, ahead of CPE starting in April 2012. A report is currently scheduled to go to Cabinet on 15th November on Civil Parking Enforcement – South and East Cambridgeshire.

The agreement will not be finalised until Cabinet has approved the CPE application and powers have been granted by Government. Officers have an expectation that an agreement will be signed towards the end of the financial year.

Update

The transition and implementation planning project is making good progress.

The call down contract for infrastructure related services was finalised in September. The call down contract Local Area Network (LAN) Management is expected to be placed by the end of November. Progress with call down contracts from partners is good, with call down contracts are expected to be placed by end October/early November.

Planning is underway for the Information Technology resilience work to be undertaken with the remaining CPSN capital and a schedule of work will be formulated within the next 2-3 months.

14th June 9. Minute 392. Future of Educational Provision in 2011 Gamlingay

Cabinet agreed to delegate authority to the Cabinet Member for Learning and the Executive Director: Children and Young People's Services to take forward the statutory consultation on Option 1 to federate Gamlingay Village College with Stratton Upper school.

Progress Update

Following the Cabinet decision on 14 June 2011, advice was sought from the Department for Education (DfE) in respect of the appropriate route for securing a formal partnership arrangement between Gamlingay Village College and Stratton Upper School, Biggleswade, Bedfordshire.

Stratton Upper School has completed consultation on proposals to change status from a community school to an academy and anticipates that conversion taking place in mid autumn 2011.

As an Academy, which is a publicly funded independent school, cannot enter into a federation with a maintained school, the advice received was that Gamlingay Village College would need to apply to change its status from a foundation school to an academy as the first step towards a formal partnership with Stratton. Gamlingay Village College's Governing Body met at the end of July and passed a formal resolution to apply to become an academy. An application has now been submitted. The school will undertake consultation in the autumn term on the proposal that the school should become an academy operating in formal partnership with Stratton Upper School.

10. Minute 397. Provision of Secondary School in Cambourne

Cabinet agreed to delegate to the Local Government Shared Services (LGSS): Director Finance and the Cabinet Member for Resources and Performance agreement of the terms for the acquisition of the land required for:

- the new Cambourne secondary school and access road;
- a fourth primary school to safeguard the Council's position should such a school be needed in future; and
- That should the Comberton Education Trust's (CET) application to establish the new secondary school as a Free School be unsuccessful, the County Council supported the establishment of the Cambourne Secondary school as an academy promoted by the CET.

Following negotiations, terms have now been agreed with the Consortium and the County Council's legal section has been instructed to progress a conditional contract.

The output from this review to inform the Integrated Planning process for the financial year 2011-12.
- b) That no further bus subsidy reductions were to be implemented before the adoption of the 2012-2013 Integrated Plan.

12. Minute 424. Investment In Superfast **Broadband**

Following the publication of the Cabinet Report the following text (2 items as shown below) was added to the draft consultation response prior to its sending on to Hunts DC as a final response.

The following additional comments were made on the Preliminary Draft Charging Schedule consultation.

1)Surface Water Management Plans in Huntingdonshire are currently being prepared. They will identify areas vulnerable to surface water flooding, look at the causes, and then suggest solutions. The solutions are likely to lead to new surface water flooding infrastructure projects being planning in the future (but currently unknown at this stage). Such

projects should be added to the CIL Regulation 123 infrastructure list once they are known, therefore allowing them to be eligible to benefit from CIL receipts.

2). The Godmanchester Flood Alleviation Scheme is an Environment Agency project that would benefit from receiving CIL funding. Consideration should be given to adding this project to the Infrastructure Project List and we'd welcome further discussion.
