1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Given the increasing importance of relationships between the Council and the Business Community, it is suggested that it would be useful to create a new role of a Member Business Champion to act as a focal point for relationships between the Council and businesses. It is envisaged that this would operate in much the same way as the role of Cycling Champion. This would not be a role that carries any decision making responsibilities or any special responsibility allowance, but would be an opportunity to focus relationships with the business community and to provide a useful two way channel of communication.
- 1.2 The creation of the role of Business Champion has been discussed at a recent Economy and Environment Spokespersons meeting. If the Committee agrees the recommendation to create this new role, it is suggested that an appropriate Member is appointed to fulfil the function.
