

Draft Public Mental Health Strategy	E de Zoete	Highlight, beyond what was already in the document about early years settings and workforce training and development, the importance of providing 1:1 support for mothers of young babies, and of promoting friendships among mothers	 One of the proposed actions has been amended to reflect discussions at Health Committee. It now reads as: "Maximise opportunities to promote mental health across the early years workforceand in early years settings, particularly with the commissioning of Health Visitors andFamily Nurse Partnership transferring to Cambridgeshire County Council in October2015. This might for example include the development of an early years workforcemental health training strategy and maximising opportunities to reach sociallyisolated new mothers". Other changes made in response to comments from the Committee: A health inequalities map was added with an emphasis that within affluent areas there can also be deprived households. The list of strategies was moved to the back of the document and they were divided into those which focus on wider determinants of mental health. Within the action plan, the anti-bullying strategy was further explained and the order rearranged. References added for diagram on page 9 of the document. 	Yes
