Childcare Sufficiency Assessment 2014
Action Plan

Date: 3 June 2014

The Childcare Act 2006 sets out in legislation the role of local authorities in facilitating the childcare market, first laid out in the Childcare Act 2004. The local authority has a role in managing the childcare market.

Section 11 of the Act places a duty to assess childcare provision. Following on from the childcare sufficiency assessment, local authorities have a duty to secure sufficient accessible, flexible, affordable childcare to meet parents' needs.

The availability of sufficient and affordable, good quality childcare contributes to the wider council's vision and priorities.

During autumn 2013, research was carried out to establish the supply and demand for early years and childcare places across the County. This involved online surveys with childcare providers and parents. Feedback regarding childcare availability and demand was also obtained from Councillors, Children's Centres and children.

A total of 700 parents and 818 childcare providers contributed the research on the supply and demand of childcare.

The views of children's experience of childcare were also sought. 24 children participated through simple questionnaires. The younger children expressed their experience by painting / drawing pictures of their favourite things.

Key objectives of the assessment

- To ensure supply for childcare matches demand
- To ensure the supply of childcare for meets the needs of specific groups of people
- · Families know where to access information about childcare

The principal actions arising from the assessment are listed below, under five key objectives:

- 1. Improve availability of sufficient early years and childcare places across Cambridgeshire
- 2. Increase availability of early years and childcare provision for shift workers
- 3. Ensure early years and Childcare provision has a suitably qualified workforce
- 4. Ensure families are informed (or know where to access information) about childcare availability and affordability
- 5. Ensure children with SEND have access to suitable early years and childcare provision
