#### **DOCTOR ALAN RODGER**

The Chairman read out a tribute to Dr Alan Roger, the Forum's Vice Chairman who had sadly passed away early in the year after a period of illness (Attached as Appendix 1 to these minutes). As a mark of respect Forum stood and observed a minutes silence. A condolence card was sent round to Forum members for signature.

### 138. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE AND DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Apologies were as set out above.

There were no declarations of interest.

#### 139. SCHOOLS FORUM MINUTES – 18<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2019

The minutes of the meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2019 were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

#### 140. ACTION LOG

The Forum noted the Minute Action Log with the following updates:

- Minutes 136 – Schools Funding Update – The Service Director, Education informed Forum that he followed up the action request with a former colleague regarding how Suffolk County Council (SCC) were managing their deficit. He stated that SCC had implemented a deficit action plan that proposed significant reductions to the financial support allocated to children and the High Needs Block (HNB). He commented that SCC believed that they had an effective delivery plan to implement the changes. He explained that SCC were facing similar financial challenges to Cambridgeshire County Council (CCC) due to the inadequacies of the national funding formula.

Individual members raised the following issues in relation to the action log:

queried whether SCC had proposed a transfer to the HNB greater than 0.5%.
 The Service Director, Education confirmed that SCC had proposed a 0.5% transfer.

#### 141. SCHOOLS FUNDING UPDATE - JANUARY 2020

Schools Forum considered a report providing an update on the latest local funding formula proposals for the 2020/21 Schools budget setting round. The Service Director, Education and the Strategic Finance Business Partner drew the Forum's attention to the 2020/21 Dedicated Schools Grant Funding – Addendum (Schools Forum – January 2020), the Illustrative Schools Funding Scenarios – 2020/21 and the Update on Send Recovery Plan documents, attached as Appendix 2, 3 and 4 to these minutes.

The Service Director, Education:

- highlighted the proposed additional recommendation found within the presentation. He stated that as Forum had approved a 0% transfer at the last meeting, the recommendation was requesting Forum to reconsider a block transfer of 0.5% from the Schools Block to the HNB. The Chairman requested more information regarding the exact time scales for agreeing the final budget. The Strategic Finance Business Partner confirmed that the budget setting process depended on when Officers received approval for the 1.8% transfer from the Secretary of State. The Service Director, Education confirmed that the Local Authority (LA) had to set a budget on the 21st January 2020, with a view that they would resubmit the budget following the CYP Committee meeting also on the 21st January. He believed that the LA could still re-submit budget proposals up until the 28th February.
- informed Forum that on the 13<sup>th</sup> January 2020, the Strategic Finance Business Partner, the Chairman and himself had met with Officers from the Department for Education (DfE). At this meeting Officers submitted their recovery plan for the HNB, discussed the financial challenges faced by Cambridgeshire and the affects this was having on schools. Officers also proposed a number of requests to the DfE such as a revision to the national funding formula to increase the amount of money allocated to the HNB and further financial support to CCC to help mitigate their deficit through cash flow loans. However, Officers from the DfE were unable to provide any answers to the queries raised by the LA at this meeting while commenting as to how inclusive Cambridgeshire were.
- informed Forum that he had met with Lucy Frazer MP to discuss the financial pressures the LA faced. He commented that she had been very supportive of the issues raised. In addition, he had arranged separate meetings for the following week with Steven Barkley MP and Daniel Zeichner MP to undertake similar conversations. A further meeting had been arranged with Nick Gibb MP (Minister of State for School Standards at the Department for Education) on the 28<sup>th</sup> January 2020, in which he had been invited to represent Cambridgeshire County Council.
- confirmed that Officers had formally written to the Education Schools Funding Agency (ESFA) to request a £16m loan to negate the cash flow challenges the LA were facing.

The Chairman confirmed that the presentation the Service Director, Education and the Strategic Finance Business Partner had given at their meeting with the DfE was comprehensive and fully highlighted the financial issues Cambridgeshire was facing. No indication was given by the DfE officers that there would be a positive outcome arising from the meeting.

Individual members raised the following issues in relation to Appendix 2, 3 and 4:

- sought more information regarding how Cambridgeshire's financial position compared to that of other LAs in England. The Service Director, Education suggested that 24 other LAs had submitted deficit recovery plans to the DfE. He speculated that around 50 other LAs would be faced with a deficit on the HNB by the end of this financial year. He commented that the continued rise in pupil numbers had caused an increase in financial pressure on LAs.
- requested confirmation regarding the cuts that would occur if Forum agreed a 0% transfer. The Service Director, Education stated a 0% transfer could lead to

significant reduction in the financial supported given to schools with children with Special Educational Needs (SEN). He commented that the proposed 1.8% would help mitigate the current deficit.

- queried the material impacts a 0.5% transfer would have on the current deficit compared to a 0% transfer. The Service Director, Education stated that this had not been estimated completely, and while a 0.5% would not solve the financial issues the LA faced, it would be a contribution towards the outstanding deficit. He reminded Forum that the consultation response agreed to a 0.5% transfer. Another member of the Forum raised concerns that a 0.5% transfer would lead to greater debts within schools.
- stated that at the last meeting Forum had agreed on a 0% transfer to send a political message to Central Government and queried whether Forum should now be discussing the possibility of a 1.8% transfer. The Service Director, Education confirmed that Officers were considering a 1.8% transfer, subject to the Secretary of State's approval. He stated that if the Secretary of State did agree to a 1.8% transfer then a comprehensive debate would be required at CYP Committee as to the financial implications this would have on schools budgets in Cambridgeshire. The Service Director, Education stated that this was a difficult decision and the LA would have to consider in detail where the proposed savings would be made for the next financial year.
- expressed concerns that Forum could be facing this same financial situation year after year.
- requested more information regarding the number of referrals for Educational Health Care Plan (EHCPs). The Service Director, Education confirmed that the demand for EHCP referrals was increasing and the number of EHCPs approved had increased by 60 in December 2019 alone. This increase in demand continued to put greater financial pressure on the LA.
- stated that it was important for Forum to agree on a recommendation that gave Officers the best opportunity to put pressure on Government for a better funding settlement, he believed that agreeing a 0.5% transfer would not do this. The member stated that at the last meeting, Forum decided that they could not agree to a further transfer that would support an inadequate funding formula for Cambridgeshire. The Service Director, Education suggested that agreeing a 0% transfer did send a strong political message but raised concerns regarding the impact this decision would have on school's budgets in the future.
- suggested that a 0% transfer would be more beneficial for their school compared to a 0.5% transfer. The Service Director, Education reiterated that this was a difficult situation as the financial implications of the funding changes the LA was proposing would vary from school to school in the County.
- queried the relevance of Forum agreeing to a 0.5% transfer when a 1.8% was still a possibility. He believed that if a 1.8% transfer was being proposed then Forum should stick with the agreed 0% transfer and make the political statement to Government. The Service Director, Education explained that the CYP Committee could only agree to a 1.8% transfer if the Secretary of State approved it. He clarified that if the Secretary of State did agree to a 1.8% transfer and

Forum did not agree to a 0.5% transfer then the only option CYP would have to consider would be either a 1.8% increase or a 0% transfer.

- a County Councillor explained that he was to attend and represent
   Cambridgeshire at a F40 meeting next week. This group consisted of the 40 LAs
   who received the least funding from Government. He suggested that it would be
   politically beneficial if these 40 LAs could agree to lobby Government for a better
   funding formula. The Service Director, Education stated that it was critical for
   Cambridgeshire voice to be heard at this Group.
- queried whether during the Director's meeting with Officers from the DfE, they had shown any awareness regarding the fact that the financial issues faced in Cambridgeshire were also found at a national level. The Service Director, Education explained that the DfE had acknowledged that there was not enough funding allocated to Special Educational Need and Disability (SEND) services nationally. He explained to the DfE representative that Cambridgeshire historically had been significantly underfunded which had led to the LA and schools being put under significant financial pressure.
- explained that she was divided on the discussion as she personally believed that
  the Forum should send a strong political message to Government by sticking with
  the previously agreed 0% transfer. However, her role on the Forum was to
  represent her sector and her sector had agreed to approve a 0.5% transfer. With
  this in mind a number of members reminded Forum that they attended the
  meeting to represent their specific sector and not their personal views.
- sought more information regarding what schools were doing with their outstanding balances. He suggested that it would be beneficial if those schools with large balances put this money back into the County to help alleviate the funding shortfall rather than it sitting in a bank account.
- raised concerns regarding the fact that Forum had just been focusing on the
  possibility of a 0.5% transfer and not discussing the 1.8% transfer in detail and
  the effects this would have on schools in Cambridgeshire. He believed that a
  1.8% transfer was going to be considered at CYP Committee if the Secretary of
  State approved it. The Service Director, Education stated that Forum had
  agreed to a 0% transfer at the last meeting and this recommendation would be
  fed into the discussion at the CYP Committee.
- reminded Officers that at the last meeting, all Forum members had agreed that they would not support a 1.8% transfer.
- sought more information regarding the four potential scenarios to be considered
  when deciding the final budget. The Service Director, Education clarified that the
  all four potential budget proposals presented to the Forum meeting would
  increase the amount of money given to schools compared to previous years.
- queried the position Forum would be put into if the CYP Committee agreed a
  1.8% transfer. The Service Director, Education explained that a 1.8% transfer
  gave the LA time and allowed them to protect the services they currently
  provided for schools until potential further reforms of the national funding formula
  were implemented by Ministers. The Service Director, Education speculated that
  if Forum did agree a 0% transfer now, then next year they could be facing a

proposal for a transfer greater than 1.8%. He reminded Forum that the LA had a statutory requirement to set a balanced budget each financial year.

- queried what the Officer recommendations would be on the Schools Funding Formula 2020-21 report being presented to the CYP Committee on the 21<sup>st</sup> January 2020. The Service Director, Education confirmed that the report would not have an Officer recommendation, rather the CYP Committee would make a decision through the discussion had at the meeting. He stated that if he was asked for an opinion during this Committee meeting, he would suggest a 1.8% transfer. He strongly recommended for Forum members to attend the CYP Committee.
- asked whether they had an indication of how Members of the CYP Committee viewed a 1.8% transfer. The Service Director, Education stated that there would be no political element to the discussion at the CYP Committee but had no indication of what their decision would be.
- stated that it appeared that smaller special schools would be most at risk from the budget proposals presented today.
- suggested that it was paramount for Forum to provide the CYP Committee with as much flexibility as possible when they discussed and approved the final budget.
- queried whether the proposed £50 reduction in Minimum Per Pupil Funding (MPPF) would be brought back to Forum for approval. The Service Director, Education stated if the Secretary of State and the CYP Committee approved the 1.8% transfer then he would wish to consult with both schools and Forum on the £50 reduction. He suggested that Officers could then take Forum's decision on MPPF and recommend it to the CYP Committee.
- asked Officers whether they could record what each sector representative voted for. Other Forum members and Officers commented that this would be impracticable as some Forum members represented two sectors.
- expressed concerns regarding the fact that if Forum voted for a 0% transfer then
  they were making a 1.8% transfer more likely to occur as CYP Committee would
  have no flexibility to consider any other options. The Service Director, Education
  believed that Officers had until the 28th February to set the schools budget, and
  following the meeting they would check whether they could re-submit the budget.
  He commented that if the Secretary of State did not approve the 1.8% transfer
  then Forum could reconsider the 0.5% transfer. The Service Director, Education
  stated that if this happened, they could provide schools with more information
  regarding the specific financial implications a 0.5% transfer would cause.
  (ACTION)
- The Service Director, Education reiterated the fact that if the Secretary of State
  did not approve the 1.8% transfer and Forum did not agree a 0.5% transfer then
  the only option for CYP to consider would be a 0% transfer. The Strategic
  Finance Business Partner explained that Forum had the authority to approve up
  to a 0.5% transfer, anything greater would have to be approved by the Secretary
  of State.

- believed that Forum should delay the vote until the LA had received confirmation regarding whether the Secretary of State had approved the proposed 1.8% transfer.
- suggested that the possibility of having a 1.8% transfer was influencing the
  debate around the 0.5% transfer. He believed that if the Secretary of State did
  not approve the 1.8% transfer then Forum could have a more comprehensive
  debate around the 0.5% transfer.
- requested more information regarding the financial implications the different transfer levels would have on the schools budget. The Director of Education confirmed that he would look into this (ACTION).
- agreed to hold an emergency Schools Forum meeting once Officers had heard from the Secretary of State.
- confirmed that if any Forum member wished to speak at the CYP Committee they should contact Democratic Services.

Having commented on the previous budget proposals:

#### It was resolved to:

#### a) 2020/21 School Funding Arrangements

Agree to uphold the previous decision made by Forum on the 18<sup>th</sup> December 2019 to approve a 0% transfer. However, a 0.5% transfer could be reconsidered subject to Secretary of State's decision not to approve the 1.8% transfer.

#### b) De-Delegations

Subject to confirmation of the Department for Education (DFEs) risk protection arrangements, maintained Primary representatives on Schools Forum approved the continuation of the de-delegations in respect of insurance.

#### 142. PROPOSED FUTURE SCHOOLS FORUM DATES AFTER JULY

Forum considered a report outlining the proposed future Schools Forum dates after July 2020.

It was resolved to

a) agree the following dates:

Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November 2020 Wednesday 16th December 2020 Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021 Friday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2021 Friday 21<sup>st</sup> May 2021 Friday 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021.

b) For officers to relook at the proposed date of Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March 2021 as this was the last day of term.

## Chairman's Tribute to Alan Rodger

I would like at this time to say a few words regarding Dr Alan Rodger, the Vice Chairman, who sadly died on Friday 3rd January, Alan was a modest, quiet and gentle man who always had time for others. He dealt with his long and debilitating illness with dignity and calmness, never letting it get the better of him.

Alan was dedicated to Antarctica and polar science and his impact in British Antarctic Survey was significant over his 40 year career. He wrote a great many papers about, not only the antarctic, but also about the causes and effects of climate change which are currently so topical. Alan was the BAS Board Member for science Strategy and in 2012 was appointed Interim Director for just over a year prior to his retirement.

Alan became a great friend of mine over the years he was a governor and trustee of schools in Cambridgeshire and a member of Cambridgeshire's governor advisory group. Later he became a member of the Cambridgeshire Schools Forum in November 2005. For much of this time he was the Vice Chairman. We worked very well together and we met with M.P.s, Ministers and Officers of the Department for Education in our campaign for improvement in funding for education. At these meetings Alan was excellent in explaining our funding problems, arguing our case with consummate ease and was always scrupulously polite even when the DfE were not prepared to offer support for the obvious needs of children in our schools.

As a member of Forum, his greatest asset was to challenge proposals but always in the most polite way. I know his views were highly respected by fellow members for this and for the clarity with which he spoke about really quite complex issues. I will always feel very privileged to have known Alan for what must be well in excess of 20 years and for the wonderful working relationship we had. I will miss him greatly as I am sure we all will.

His funeral will take place next Friday at 11.00 and his family would welcome any of us who are able to attend. It will take place at the City of Cambridge Crematorium following which a buffet lunch in celebration of Alan's life will be held at the Aurora Conference Room at British Antarctic Survey. Detailed information about the day are available for any of us who are able to attend.

May I conclude by asking you to stand and observe a minute's silence in memory of Alan.

 The initial 2020-21 DSG allocations for Cambridgeshire are set out in the following table, which also provides the 2019-20 figures for comparison:

## **National Funding Announcements**

- The increase in the Schools Block for 2020-21 totals £20.9m.
- Approximately £17.3m is as a result of the uplift to Cambridgeshire's Schools Block allocation from the additional investment through the national funding formula;
- Approximately £3.8m increase resulting from the increase in pupils between October 2018 and October 2019.
- Approximate £0.2m reduction in funding for growth based on the revised DfE formula.



- After allowing for the £2m centrally retained growth fund the total available Schools Block for distribution (prior to any block transfers) is £368.2m.
- This compares to the £345.1m distributed in 2019/20.
- Final distribution figures are still subject to decisions in respect of the potential block transfers from the Schools Block to the High Needs Block.



 Prior to any potential block transfers from the Schools Block to the High Needs Block the available HNB totals:

2020/21 HNB (Updated December 2019)	£75.01m
Agreed Transfer from CSSB	£1.14m
Total available HNB	£76.15m

- 19/20 in-year forecast spend in excess of £81m.
- Adjusted Deficit b/fwd from 18/19 = £7.15m
- Forecast Deficit to c/fwd to 20/21 = £17m+



- On the 13<sup>th</sup> January at the meeting with DfE officials we were notified that the LA may not receive the outcomes of our disapplication requests by the APT submission deadline of 21<sup>st</sup> January. (This was later confirmed by email.)
- This means that there is still uncertainty over the final approach to be taken and timescales for publication of the final budgets.
- The DfE have stated however that we are still required to submit an APT by the 21<sup>st</sup> January deadline based on assumptions of the final approach to be taken.



- There are currently 4 potential scenarios still being considered:
  - a) 0% / £0 block transfer 1.84% MFG 6.11% CAP
  - b) 1.8% /£6.66m block transfer 1.84% MFG 0.45% CAP
  - c)-1.8% / £6.66m block transfer reduced MPPLs to £3,700 and £4,950 - 1.84% MFG – 2.17% CAP
  - d) 0.5% / £1.85m block transfer 1.84% MFG 4.10% CAP
- The illustrative impact of each of these scenarios can be seen in Appendix 1 to this presentation.
- Figures have been updated to reflect the October 2019 census data and as such the impact at individual school level will also be dependent on changes in pupil numbers.



## Please note:

- These figures are still illustrative at this stage and are subject to change as final data validation is undertaken.
- As previously discussed final block transfers and reductions to MPPL are still subject to approval at the appropriate level.
- Actual amounts to be received by academies will be notified directly by the ESFA for the 20/21 academic year and may differ due to pupil numbers, protections and business rates applied.

- As previously highlighted the DfE has recently consulted on extending the risk protection arrangement (RPA) currently operational for academy trusts (ATs) to the local authority maintained school (LAMS) sector.
- The consultation ended on 4 November and the DfE had planned to publish the response in the first week of December. However, as a result of purdah, the publication of the government's response has been delayed and is due on the 17<sup>th</sup> January.

# **Insurance De-delegations**



The original RPA consultation states that:

"We propose that it will also be possible for all LAMS in a LA to join collectively by agreeing through the Schools Forum to dedelegate funding, as they currently can for purposes including insurance. In that case we propose the LA would apply for membership on behalf of all of the schools, though LAMS would become individual members and make individual claims."

- We would therefore propose that maintained primary representatives approve a continuing de-delegation in respect of insurance.
- Once final details of the RPA have been published we will provide further information via email and propose the approach to be taken for 2020/21.

## **Required Actions**



- Maintained Primary representatives on Schools Forum are asked to approve the continuation of de-delegations in respect of Insurance.
- The final approach i.e. whether this will be via the LA or RPA will be confirmed on receipt of the published consultation response.

- Local authorities and schools do not need to negotiate individual licences. The DfE pays the cost, including VAT, to the agencies and provides this as a service to local authorities at a charge.
- These arrangements cover academies as well as maintained schools.
- The funding is held centrally rather than being included in school budgets.
- For 2020/21 the overall cost (excluding VAT) for Cambridgeshire schools has increased from £439k to £450k.
- The £11k increase will be met from the Central Schools Services Block (CSSB) rather than being a direct cost to schools.

## **Next Steps**



- All budget timescales are now dependent on DfE confirmation of disapplication requests.
- 21st January 2020 Children and Young People Committee to approve final budget proposals
- 21<sup>st</sup> January 2020 APT submission deadline to the ESFA
- February budgets to be issued to Primary and Secondary Schools (academy budgets will be illustrative only as final budgets will be confirmed by the ESFA).
- Spring 2020 High Needs Consultation to be launched.



# **Workstream 1:** Top Up Fees

Purpose: Universal Reduction of Top Up Fees by Reviewing Banding

<u>Timescales:</u> Implementation new banding Sept 2020

- We need to put more structure around the way we allocate funding
- We will need skilled people to create the criteria on the banding
- We will need to apply a best fit model
- Moderation should be built into the process
- We will need to be careful about increasing numbers of tribunals in a banding system
- The longer term overall aspiration is to put more money into early support to reduce demand later in the system



### Workstreams 2 &3: RAIISE and High Cost Top Up Reviews

<u>Purpose</u>: To generate savings against current planned expenditure (RAIISE) and a comprehensive review of all high cost placements across Special Schools (Phase 1) and Mainstream settings (phase 2)

<u>Timescales</u>: June 2020 (RAIISE), December 2020 (High Cost Top Ups)

- We will need to look at all high cost placements
- This is an opportunity to review needs is this child getting too much or too little support? Is it time to reduce the level of support?
- We need to develop the messages with parents that there is not enough money and we need to reduce our spend

- We will need to hold a firm line on the updated guidance on tuition that sign off from both a GP and medical practitioner will be required
- More outreach work would be useful here to enable children to come back into the system
- ◆ To increase the rigour in out of school tuition an option would be to bring the service back in house and run it as an LA service. There are options for schools to be involved in the delivery of this service also.



### **Workstream 6: SEND Service Restructure**

<u>Purpose</u>: To identify efficiencies within senior management, benchmark salaries, review the district teams and review SEND Sensory Support

<u>Timescales</u>: April 2020

- Moving to a more place based approach may be beneficial.
- Sensory support is an area in which we have high spend, an option would be to shift to systems of inclusive support in local schools
- Specialist teaching service is far higher in Cambridgeshire than other areas.
   Options could be a hub model co-located with special schools. This could potentially be commissioned to schools with partners.

## **Workstream 7: Alternative Provision**

Purpose: To understand and address the need for the use of alternative provision

<u>Timescales</u>: Recommissioning of BAIPs model by September 2020

## **Feedback from HNB Working Group:**

- Our spend in this area is high compared to statistical neighbours
- Part of this workstream will be around how we support inclusion in primary schools.

## **Further points for consideration:**



- It would be useful to carry out research then training into how schools can tap into funding and generate income accordingly. This is something that schools often don't have the capacity to do but that could be worked on with Pinpoint.
- Schools need help to be more creative with provision and bring children together to make the savings
- The criteria for thresholds needs to be reviewed and templates should be shared with schools (the new LA Synergy system will help with this)
- ◆ To reduce duplication and ensure consistency, we could work with health and social care to create brand new roles that would need more specialist training. This would mean people are more effective as they are interchangeable between roles and may make life easier for those with acute medical needs. Kim will lead on a proposal for this and will link in with the job families in maintained schools work that is currently underway.

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# EARLY YEARS NATIONAL FUNDING FORMULA: 2020-21 PROPOSALS INCLUDING NURSERY SCHOOLS

#### Recommendation:

#### 1.0 CONTEXT

- 1.1 The Department for Education (DfE) introduced the Early Years National funding formula in April 2017 and a new early learning and childcare scheme for working parents from September 2017. Eligible working parents are entitled to access an additional 15 hours of free childcare above the Universal Entitlement (570 hours per year) to enable them to access 30 hours of free childcare (1140 hours per year) in total.
- 2.0 Summary of the Proposed 3- and 4- year old Cambridgeshire Formula for 2020-21

#### 2.1 Hourly rate

On October 2019 the Department for Education (DfE) announced an increase in the hourly rate paid to Cambridgeshire for 2020/21 of 8p per hour, from £4.42 to £4.50. This increase in funding has given Cambridgeshire the flexibility to propose an increase to the 3- and 4- year old base rate of funding to providers of 9p an hour, from £4.05 to £4.14.

#### 2.2 Supplements

To keep the formula as simple as possible, deprivation will remain the only supplement within the formula. This would be allocated in the same way as at present as set out in the table overleaf:

#### 2.3 Special Education Needs (SEN) Inclusion Fund

Funding of £0.5m per year will be provided from each of the High Needs and Early Years Blocks of funding, to form an SEN inclusion fund (SENIF) totalling £1m. The SENIF provides funding for 3 and 4 year olds who are accessing either their Universal, or Extended Entitlement to early learning and childcare and who have complex additional needs. Funding will provided in the form of top-ups or lump sums for providers according to the needs of individual pupils.

#### 2.4 <u>Early Years Centrally Retained Funding</u>

The Early Years Funding guidelines restricts local authorities to retaining a maximum of 5% of funding centrally from 2018/19 onwards. The proposed funding retained centrally by the Local Authority will account for approximately 3.6% of the funding provided (dependent on pupil numbers), 1.4% lower than the statutory maximum.

The following table overleaf shows the proposed centrally retained amounts for the financial year 2020-21:

In addition to these amounts, we are proposing to allocate £250k of an ongoing underspend to allow the extension of the SEN Inclusion fund to funded two year olds. Details of this additional fund will be made available in due course.

#### 2.5 Funding to Nursery Schools

While the future of additional funding to nursery school is still unclear, the DfE confirmed in October 2019 that supplementary funding for Maintained Nursery Schools (MNS) will be allocated to local authorities in 2020-21 at their 2019-20 supplementary funding rate. As such, supplementary funding to MNS will continue at the current levels in 2020-21.

#### 3.0 Funding in addition to the hourly rate

- 3.1 **Deprivation Supplement:** Will continue at the rates outlined earlier in this document.
- 3.2 **Early Years Pupil Premium:** Will continue to be paid at a rate of £0.53 per hour for eligible children.
- 3.3 **Disability Access Funding:** the £615 lump sum paid to settings for eligible children will continue.
- 3.4 **Top-up funding from SEN Inclusion fund:** Funding rates will continue to be determined based on the individual needs of the child and in accordance with separate published policy and guidelines.

#### 3.5 Two-year-old funding

Two-year-old funding will continue to be administered in the same way as currently. Cambridgeshire will receive an increased rate of £5.49, and this will be passed on in full

to providers.

#### 4.0 **Sector Consultation**

- 4.1 For the purpose of agreeing the proposals for the 2020-21 formula, the local authority has consulted with the Early Years Provider Reference Group as representatives of the sector. The proposals have been developed following discussions at the Group in November 2019 and confirmed in January 2020.
- 4.2 In coming to agreement, the Reference Group made clear:
  - the increase proposed by the local authority continues to fall behind the real cost per hour of funded provision; in the current year, real costs have been estimated to have risen between 6% and 8% (against a 2% increase)
  - the funding gap is therefore increasing from an already challenging position, with no increase between 2017 and 2019, and a 1p per hour increase (0.25%) increase in 2019-20.
  - this shortfall creates pressures on provision reflected in uncompetitive rates of pay, leading to recruitment and retention challenges across the county and sector
  - the Group's support for the proposals is based on the benefit which funding for two-year-olds with SEN will gain from the additional £250k.

# **Latest Funding Positon**



- Since the last Schools Forum meeting in January:
  - The Service Director: Education has met with a number of local MPs to discuss the funding issues facing Cambridgeshire Schools
  - We have met with the DfE SEND Advisor and the ESFA to review our recovery plan. Feedback in the meeting was positive.
  - Met with Nick Gibb Minister for Schools Standards to highlight the particular pressures in respect of High Needs.
  - The LA received notification on 11<sup>th</sup> February that the disapplication request to transfer 1.8% of the Schools Block to support High Needs pressures has been declined.
  - Based on information from other LA's we understand only 2 of 29 transfer requests were accepted due to very unique area specific circumstances.

# **Latest Funding Positon**



- The DfE have confirmed that the Minimum Per Pupil Levels (MPPL) of £3,750 for Primary and £5,000 for secondary will be mandatory and as such LA's will have no flexibility to amend
- The number of EHCPs and associated cost has continued to increase resulting in a revised forecast cumulative deficit in the region of £18m to the end of 2019/20 (excluding Early Years).
- The DfE have updated statutory guidance to make it clear that a DSG deficit must be carried forward to be dealt with from future DSG income, unless the Secretary of State authorises the LA not to do this.
- The DfE have also confirmed that where a local authority has a substantial in-year overspend or cumulative DSG deficit balance at the end of the financial year, its management plan should look to bring the overall DSG account into balance within a timely period.



- After allowing for the £2m centrally retained growth fund the total available Schools Block for distribution (prior to any block transfers) is £368.2m.
- This compares to the £345.1m distributed in 2019/20.
- As a result of the decisions detailed on the previous slides there are now only 2 potential scenarios still being considered in respect of the main Schools budgets:
  - 1) 0% / £0 block transfer 1.84% MFG 5.96% CAP
  - 2) 0.5% / £1.85m block transfer 1.84% MFG 4.05% CAP

- Figures have been updated slightly since the previous version to reflect the latest business rates information where available.
- High Needs 19/20 in-year forecast spend in excess of £82m.
- Adjusted Deficit b/fwd from 18/19 = £7.15m
- Forecast DSG Deficit to c/fwd to 20/21 = £18m+ (excluding Early Years)

- These figures are still illustrative at this stage and are subject to change as final data validation is undertaken.
- Actual amounts to be received by academies will be notified directly by the ESFA for the 20/21 academic year and may differ due to pupil numbers, protections and business rates applied.

- The total available HNB in 19/20 totals £71.041m (including transfers from Schools Block and CSSB, but excluding £0.5m EY SENIF)
- As highlighted on previous slides in-year demand on the High Needs Block continues to increase with revised forecasts in the region of £82m+



- However as a result of the continued increasing deficit and decision not to approve the transfer of 1.8% from the Schools Block to the High Needs block a number of these initiatives will need to be accelerated. Options include:
  - Reducing Top-up funding for mainstream schools, units and special schools\* from April 2020.
  - Reducing spot purchase support
  - Reducing tuition packages to cases only statutory cases.
  - Immediate cessation of current High Needs Block contingency arrangements
  - Reduction in BAIP funding from September 2020
  - Reduction in central support through SEND District teams

Any changes in funding will only become live once the appropriate consultation takes place.

- \*Annex 1 of the updated High Needs operation guide provides details of the minimum funding guarantee which applies to special schools and is set at 0% compared to the minus 1.5% applicable in 2019/20.
- Therefore, in order to implement a reduction in funding, LA's are required to apply for an exemption to the MFG using the disapplication request form. Any such request will be expected to have the agreement of the local schools forum and the schools concerned.



# **Required Actions**

- Schools Forum are asked to:
  - Comment on the proposals raised in previous slides.
  - Reconsider a block transfer of 0.5% / £1.85m from the Schools Block to the High Needs Block
  - Approve a submission of a disapplication request to reduce the Special School MFG to minus 5%

## **Insurance & RPA**



- At the last Schools Forum maintained primary representatives approved a continuation of the de-delegation for insurance at a cost of £22.51 per pupil (alongside the required catch-up of £2.21 per pupil), subject to confirmation of the DfE Risk Protection Arrangements (RPA).
- The cost of the RPA for 2020/21 will be £18 per pupil.
- Uncertainties in respect of the equivalent levels of cover and the support provided to schools including:
  - the cost of the statutory engineering inspections (pressure vessels and lifting equipment).
  - motor cover for those schools which require it.
- These could result in significant additional costs for schools as a result of not being provided via LA block policies.
- Question mark around potential costs associated with existing contractual agreements if maintained schools were to move to the RPA due to how late the details have been announced.

## **Insurance & RPA**



- The Officer recommendation at this time, based on potential additional costs and uncertainties around cover is for maintained schools to continue with the LA scheme for 20/21 to allow the outstanding points of clarification with the RPA to be resolved and to allow schools to make an informed decision for 21/22.
- What this does mean however is that individual maintained schools will not be able to choose to leave the LA scheme and join the RPA as this would destabilise the current arrangements and result in an overall unfunded pressure in 20/21.

## **Next Steps**



- 28<sup>th</sup> February budgets to be issued to Primary and Secondary Schools (academy budgets will be illustrative only as final budgets will be confirmed by the ESFA).
- Spring 2020 High Needs Consultation to be launched.

#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 The January Forum meeting received and agreed proposals for future Schools Forum meetings beyond July 2020. Queries were raised on two of the proposals, especially as the school dates shown in the report only showed the maintained schools half term and end of term dates. The first was regarding why two dates had been proposed for the January 2021 date (Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> January or Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021) as they were not in a week before half term which was the reasoning for providing a Wednesday date as an alternative to the preferred Forum day of Friday, when the Friday would be the last day of term. Forum agreed the Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021 date unless any reasons transpired later on why it should not be chosen. There was a query on the suggested Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March date as this did fall on the last day of term and therefore needed to be revisited.

1.2 The dates agreed at the last Forum meeting beyond July were as follows:

Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November 2020 Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2020 Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021 Friday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2021 Friday 21<sup>st</sup> May 2021 Friday 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021.

#### 2. General Guidance for setting Schools Forum dates and dates of schools terms

- 2.1 The general guidance for setting up Schools Forum meetings in the past was that they should avoid school holiday periods and if possible and highlighted in advance, Teacher Training days The latter tends now to be more difficult as some schools pick their own teacher training days and so this is no longer a practicable requirement. Friday has always been the preferred day for Forum meetings. A more recent requirement has been that where the last day of term is a Friday, that if at all possible, (and while also taking into account of the relevant Children and Young People (CYP) Committee dates around the budget consultation / setting cycles) to have any required Schools Forum meeting the week before the last week of the term or to move it back from the Friday to the Wednesday in the last week of term. In addition, it is important that the December and January meetings coordinate with CYP Committee (who receive update reports on the funding formula in December and need to approve it at their January Committee meeting) and also to take account, if known, the Authority Proforma Tool (APT) deadlines date.
- 2.2 The maintained schools term dates and holidays for the school years 2020 and 2021 are as follows:

Easter Holiday Monday 29th March 2021 Friday 9th April 2021

Summer term begins Monday 12th April 2021 to Friday

Summer Holiday Friday starts 23rd July 2021.

#### 3. PROPOSED REVISED DATES

- 3.1 The original appendix to the January report stated that as the CYP Committee was on the 19<sup>th</sup> January 2021 officers were suggesting that it could be useful for Forum to meet a few days before the Committee to pass on any views. Two dates were offered: Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> January or Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January. In many ways the Friday is the better date as it potentially gives a little more time for officers to provide more information if there is, as has been the case in the past few years, very late Grant settlement announcements. Therefore the agreed Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January date should stand.
- 3.2 Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> March "2021 is now suggested as the March 2021 date to replace Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March 2021.
