2.	Minutes of the meeting held 27th November 2018	It was resolved to:  a) Approve the minutes of the meeting held on 24th July 2018 as a correct record.  b) Approve the amended minutes of the meeting held on 27th November 2018 as a correct record.

3.	Kings Parade Cambridge – Vehicular Access Management	<p>It was resolved to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Note the investigation and identification of the need to introduce further restrictions on motor vehicular access to Kings Parade in Cambridge.</li> <li>b) Support the introduction of further controls and the use of an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (lasting between 6 and 18 months) in order to trial potential suitable arrangements from 2019.</li> <li>c) Consider at a future meeting the outcome of this trial arrangement, determining any objections lodged during the initial 6-month formal consultation period and subsequently as required, and to decide whether to introduce a permanent scheme.</li> </ul>
