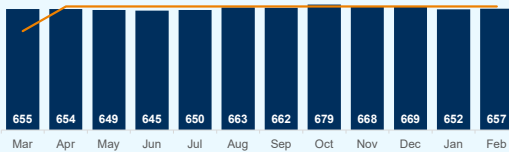

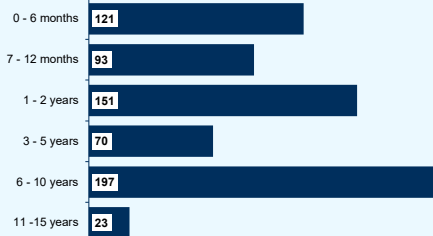

Length of time children have been in care



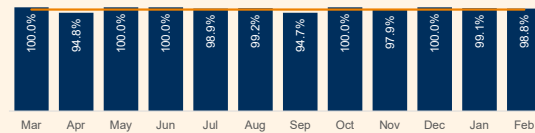

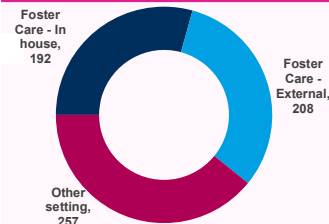

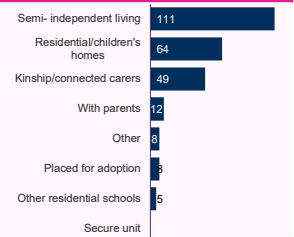

Type of home of children in care

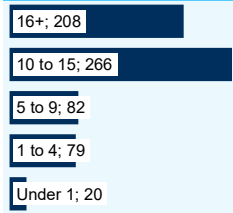

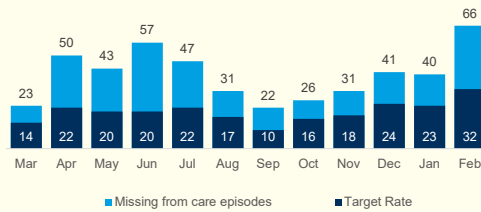

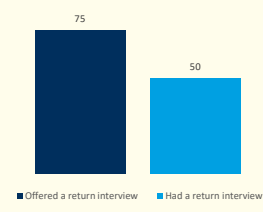
Children in care who go missing (with number of episodes)

Children in care who have a return interview



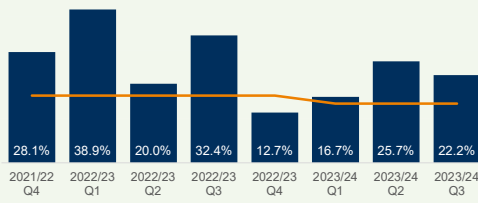

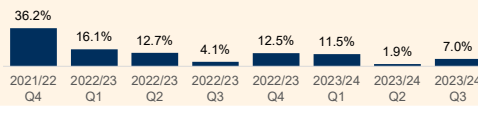

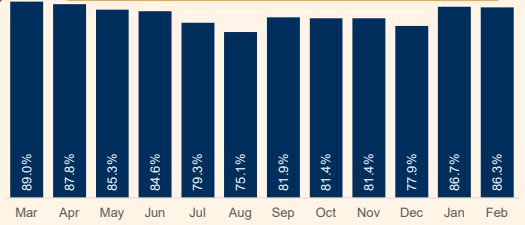


Children in care whose annual health assessment was completed on time

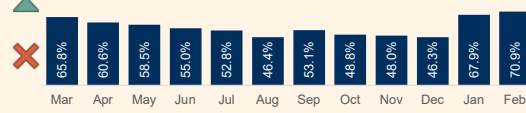

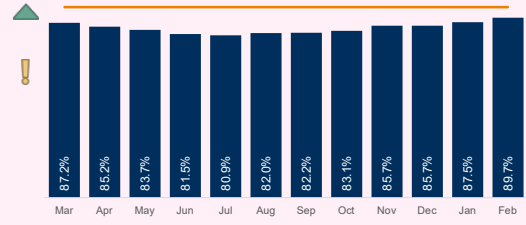

Care Leavers who have a pathway plan in place

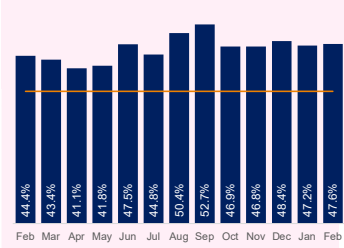
