### KEY ACTIVITY HEADLINES

- 1803 potholes completed week ending 24 April and there was a further reduction in highway faults reported and needing work. There are now only 600 remaining on the system;
- Skanska programmes of work are getting underway again, where safe to do so. 19 highway work sites are back working with a further 11 are due to start imminently;
- There has been a 94% drop in busway passenger numbers. 70% decline in traffic flows on the road network;
- Plans are being developed with the BID in Cambridge for the reallocation of road space and pedestrian management in Cambridge to support social distancing when shops open;
- The asset information team has gained the Gold Achievement Award for its Street works Data;
- A draft plan including site restrictions and traffic management for all Household Waste Sites has been prepared. Final Traffic Management and comms are being developed.
- CCC/PCC letter to Telcos/Mobile operators to encourage works while roads are quiet to be included in LGA guide to "Covid-19 good practice", also being shared by Telcos/Mobile operators with other local authorities.

### RISKS / CHALLENGES (AND MITIGATION)

- On-street parking is increasing in Cambridge with construction and builder's vehicles. This is being kept under review as there is currently no parking enforcement;

### WORKFORCE UPDATE

- 73 staff across P&E (CCC) are redeployed of which: (increased by 17 this week)
  - 32 are highways;
  - 22 are Infrastructure & Growth;
  - 2 are Passenger Transport.
  - 16 are Environment & Commercial Services;
  - 1 is Connecting Cambridgeshire.
