#### 1. ISSUE

In compliance with national planning guidance, NHS Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group (the CCG) is required to identify locally chosen NHS Quality Premium indicators.

This report is to update the Health and Wellbeing Board on the achievement of the NHS Quality Premium in the 2013/14 financial year.

The Health and Wellbeing Board is asked to note the report.

#### 2. KEY POINTS

# 2.1 Background

The NHS Quality Premium is an incentive scheme payable to CCGs. It is designed to reward CCGs for improvements in the services that they commission and for improvements in health outcomes and in reducing health inequalities. The NHS Quality Premium is paid when certain pre-qualification criteria are met. These pre-qualification criteria include financial balance.

The value of the Quality Premium depends on the achievement of several indicator targets. The maximum value overall is £5 per head of population.

## 2.2 Progress in 2013/14

In 2013/14 the CCG achieved some of the indicator targets, including all our local measures, as follows:

#### National measures:

- Friends and family roll-out plan
- Friends and family improvement A&E CCG

#### Local measures:

- Older people emergency bed days rate per person
- Primary prevention of CHD in deprived areas CCG
- Smoking at time of delivery CCG

## NHS Constitution measures:

- Incomplete RTT pathways
- 62 day cancer waits

The CCG did not achieve financial balance in 2013/14 and reported an end of year deficit of £4.9million.

As the achievement of financial balance is one of the pre-qualification criteria, the CCG will not receive a Quality Premium payment for 2013/14.
