The uplift will apply to existing commissioned rates of care from 20th April 2020 until 30th June 2020. COVID-19 has had a huge impact on the health and social care Reasons for system, including independent sector providers. Whilst social taking decision distancing protocols are starting to have a positive impact on the overall population, independent sector providers are working with health and social care to support the cohort most at risk during the period of the pandemic. This has not only resulted in an increase in the number of people requiring care and support both in the community and discharge from hospital, but also a significant increase in cost. This uplift is required and there is an imperative that it is done so urgently. Failing to do so will result in services not being provide and members of the public being at risk of serious harm. These issues will manifest in the form of providers no longer providing their services to vulnerable people as a result of not being able to continue to sustain the significant increase in costs which have been a result of COVID-19. The implications of providers no longer providing services as a result of an unsustainable costs base is the Council not being able to discharge its statutory duties as set out in the Care Act 2015. Do nothing - this could not be considered with any merit as would **Options** result in providers not receiving the necessary support at this time considered as well as the risk of the Council not discharging its duties under the Care Act 2015.
