

Civil Contingencies Act 2004



- Assess the risk of emergencies occurring and use this to inform contingency planning
- Put in place emergency plans
- Put in place business continuity plans
- Put in place arrangements to warn/inform and advise the public
- Share information and cooperate with other local responders to enhance coordination
- Provide business continuity advice to businesses and voluntary organisations




Major Incident Response plan (Command & Control)

<u>Site specific plans</u> COMAH sites, Airports, Sites with identified risks

Subject Specific plans

Fuel shortage, Pandemic Flu, Severe Weather, Flood, animal disease outbreak, special events such as the Olympics or Tour de France





Primary Risks





Current Partnership Planning areas

- Flooding

Major Accident Hazard Pipelines Regulations



- Parallel to the COMAH regulations
- Addresses pipeline network operated by National Grid







Reservoir Emergencies Regulations



- To address potential reservoir failure
- Primarily concerned with irrigation facilities in Cambridgeshire





Other County Council Responsibilities

- Tidal and river flood planning
- Temporary mortuary provision
- Support to incident strategic management
- Support to partner agencies in their response







Current Challenges




Possible impacts from Brexit highlighted to the CPLRF by Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government
