Details of decision taken

Acknowledging the ongoing cost of adhering to infection control guidance, the Government recently announced another round of Infection Control and Rapid Testing Funding. Both funds have been issued on a one-off basis and the table below outlines the level of funding received by Cambridgeshire County Council:

Infection Control Funding	Rapid Testing Funding
£2,007,140	£1,355,490

The purpose of the funding is to support adult social care providers, including those with whom the local authority doesn't contract, to:

- Reduce the rate of COVID-19 transmission within and between care settings through effective infection prevention control practices and increase uptake of staff vaccinations; and
- 2. Conduct additional rapid testing of staff and visitors in care homes, high risk supported living and extra care settings, to enable close contact visiting where possible.

All local authorities have been given a directive to passport the funding through to services quickly to support the sustainability of the sector, with a completion date of 30th June 2021 being stipulated.
