### UPDATING THE JOINT STRATEGIC NEEDS ASSESSMENT (JSNA) SUMMARY REPORT

#### **1.0 PURPOSE**

1.1 To note and comment on the updated JSNA Summary Report.

#### **2.0 BACKGROUND**

2.1 The Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB) agreed at their meeting on 15th January 2015 that an updated JSNA Summary Report was required.

2.2 Since the JSNA Summary Report for 2013/14 was published, further JSNA work has been completed. These include the following topics:

- Transport and Health
- Vulnerable Children and Families
- Prevention of ill-health in Older People

2.3 In addition to the topics listed above (point 2.2), the final report on the Long Term Conditions JSNA has been completed. This report will be presented to the Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB) on 2nd July 2015.

#### **3.0 APPROACH FOR UPDATING THE JSNA SUMMARY REPORT**

3.1 The JSNA Summary Report 2014/15 (attached as Appendix A) provides a brief overview and update on the JSNA work to date. It is designed to identify and flag key pieces of information about the health and wellbeing needs of people who live in Cambridgeshire and local inequalities in health for specific population groups.

3.2 To be explicit, the JSNA Summary Report will be updated as follows:-

- **Introduction** - updated to reflect the latest JSNA topics.
- **Summary of Health and Wellbeing Needs in Cambridgeshire.** JSNA work from 2014/15 has been added to the summary of health and wellbeing needs in Cambridgeshire, which was used to support development of the Cambridgeshire Health and Wellbeing Strategy.

The JSNA work completed in 2014/15 has provided additional information to plan for meeting the five priority needs, rather than flagging major changes in priorities.

This section includes a list of the strategies that have been adopted as annexes to the Health and Wellbeing Strategy.

- **Population and Health Statistics for Cambridgeshire** – updated with the latest data, including a web link to <http://www.cambridgeshireinsight.org.uk/health> with additional health related data.
- **Summary of JSNA reports completed over the last five years** - One page for each JSNA topic with web links to the full reports on Cambridgeshire Insight.
- **List of the previous JSNA reports** – with a brief paragraph, key findings/priority needs and the web links to the full reports.

3.3 It should be noted that the summary report does not have the depth of information needed to support planning of services; its aim is to contain enough information to help identify strategic priorities for health and wellbeing in the county.
